Adams and John K. Keilch are now organizing for the planting season. They have been Food Bank, he said. growing vegetables, herbs and flowers at the former dairy farm since 2009.

Adams and Keilch are not "looking to be retailers" and have no plans for a vegetable stand at the farm. But they are looking for 100 to 150 residents to purchase shares for this year's harvest.

"We are not looking to become huge," said Keilch. "We will offer the freshest of fresh because people want homegrown food but don't have the

time to do it themselves." "Connie is the farmer." Keilch said of his wife. "I am the worker."

Adams and Keilch opted for the Community Supported Agriculture program because it directly brings farmers and consumers together, he said. They are also members of Community Involvement in Sustaining Agriculture and the Northeast Organic Farming Association.

Several types of shares for this year's harvest are available, ranging in price from \$325 to \$575.

A full farm share provides weekly pickup of vegetables and flowers by the owner. A half vegetable share allows the holder to pick up vegetables every two weeks. Share holders will also have pickyour-own privileges.
